The bottom-line

Eligibility

Consortium composition

Unless otherwise provided for in the specific call conditions, only legal entities forming a consortium are eligible to participate in actions provided that the consortium includes, as beneficiaries, three legal entities independent from each other and each established in a different country as follows:

- at least one independent legal entity established in a Member State; and
- at least two other independent legal entities, each established in different Member States or Associated Countries.

Exceptions

Eligibility

- Coordination and support actions (CSAs) may be submitted by one or more legal entities
- Topics with additional eligibility conditions.

Example: <u>HORIZON-CL3-2022-BM-01-03</u>: <u>Better</u>, <u>more portable and quicker analysis</u> <u>and detection for customs</u>

This topic requires the active involvement, as beneficiaries, of at least 3 Customs Authorities from at least 3 different EU Member States or Associated countries. For these participants, applicants must fill in the table "Eligibility information about practitioners" in the application form with all the requested information, following the template provided in the submission IT tool.

Proposal Partnership Coordinator or Partner?

- ✓ As the idea/concept owner, you could also hand over the coordination to another partner.
- ✓ As a partner, you could also coordinate the proposal development, without being the designated coordinator of the project.

Consortium building step-by-step

- Start with a core partnership consider who the key partners should be (e.g. from your network, depending on the project concept, etc.)
- Expand the consortium once the project's scope and geographical coverage are defined
- Consider a balanced geographical representation and complementarity between types of institutions and expertise
- Involve SMEs/industry to maximise impact and exploitation
- Consider involving partners with EU project references
- If "one proposal" is expected to be funded BE QUICK!



- Similar to a movie trailer

- Avoid proprietary or confidential information
- 1-3-page document, contact details, PDF





Call: Raising awareness of circular and sustainable bioeconomy in support of Member States to develop bioeconomy strategies and/or action plans (Topic ID: <u>HORIZON-CL6-2021-</u> <u>GOVERNANCE-01</u>)

Destination: Innovative governance, environmental observations, and digital solutions in support of the Green Deal Potential Title: Empowering the Central and Eastern European Countries to Develop Bioeconomy Strategies and Action Plans (CEE2ACT)

The Challenge: The European Green Deal, the Commission's growth strategy, has set Europe on its path to be the first climate neutral continent by 2050 and achieve a green transition that must be just, fair and inclusive. One of the seven core pathways to deliver on climate neutrality, identified in the Clean Planet Strategy is the bioeconomy. The updated EU bioeconomy strategy has highlighted the relevance of developing national bioeconomy strategies and action plans to deploy a sustainable and circular bioeconomy across Europe considering economic, social and environmental aspects. To date, there are still Member States, including many from Central and Eastern Europe that do not have a national bioeconomy strategy and/or action plan despite their high biomass resource base and new bioeconomy potential. This project will support Member States to develop strategies and/or action plans by improving knowledge and raising awareness of a sustainable, circular bioeconomy, its challenges, and opportunities as well as experiences made elsewhere.

Objective: The overall objective of this project is to empower the 12 beneficiary countries in Central Eastern Europe and beyond to develop bioeconomy strategies and action plans, through knowledge transfer and innovative governance models enabling sustainability and resilience, to achieve better informed decision-making processes, societal engagement and innovation. In so doing, the project will help CEE countries to make the transition to climate neutrality. Ensuring the active participation of decision makers and public administrators in different ministries will be crucial, as well as the involvement of relevant stakeholders such as knowledge providers, universities, investors, industry, primary producers and NGOs, and general public.

Geographical scope: Hungary, Slovakia, Czech Republic, Romania, Poland, Bulgaria, Croatia, Greece, Serbia, Germany, The Netherlands, Spain, Denmark, Austria, Finland, Sweden.

Funding: EUR 4M (only 1 project to be funded), Coordination and Support Action, single stage call.


Expected timeline

Deadline for submission – <u>6 October 2021</u> Expected evaluation results – January-February 2022 Potential launch of the project – May 2022 Duration of the project: 2 years



Initial Methodology: WP2 will consist of a baseline assessment of the socio-economic, environmental aspects and challenges for the development of national bioeconomy strategies in the beneficiary countries, comparative studies in the bioeconomy sphere and different sectors will be carried out to outline the coping strategies which have emerged in the recent years, comparing different regions and the mechanisms, including carrying out interviews with policy makers and review interrelations between types of policies. WP3 will focus on stakeholder engagement activities and will be carried out to ensure the proper involvement and active participation of all relevant stakeholders (policy and decision makers, public administrators, investors, industries, SMEs, feedstock providers (e.g., waste, side streams, farmers, foresters, fishermen). WP3 will also prepare these stakeholders for the strategy development process (trainings) to create a level playing field. WP4. will focus on developing digital solutions for sustainable governance and the promotion of a green transition in the beneficiary countries. WP5. will consist of knowledge exchange and interaction, exchange of know-how and best practices on technology transfer, and building the capacities of the stakeholders to develop bioeconomy strategies and action plans. In WP6, the findings of WP2, WP3, WP4, WP5 will be synthetized, in an analytical framework. Through this framework, practical tools, guidelines, and recommendations will be developed to support beneficiary countries to develop strategies and/or action plans, improving social understanding and citizen involvement and assisting them in the transition to climate neutrality. WP7 will consist of dissemination and project sustainability activities to ensure proper internal communication as well as external communication maximising project visibility, facilitate outreach, and increase exploitation of project results. WP1 (project coordination) will ensure smooth project implementation.

The project will monitor and evaluate its activities and output development throughout the project lifetime to enable ongoing improvement and ensure expected project impact. A project evaluation plan will be developed and carried out to structure this process.


Trust issues? Non-Disclosure Agreement

- Protect your concept with an NDA
- Sign before entering the consortium & before any deep-dive into concept
- Useful when partners are involved in other proposals
- Sign it with partners that are working with you on the concept

"Where do I start?"



Looking to join a consortium

- Set your internal strategy and priorities
- Do your homework: call analysis + specific role/contribution
- Conduct targeted promotion and networking at events and social networks
- Background check and partner/coordinator mapping (CORDIS, EU networks, Google, etc.)
- Be proactive: sketch ideas, demonstrate your potential added value to proposal writing
- Join European networks and umbrella organisations
- Think long-term

Internal preparation

- System for screening of work programmes
 / calls for proposals (topics, key words)
- Database of HE calls and topics (e.g. Excel)
- Brainstorming workshops and interdepartmental cooperation
- Partner profile(s): research capacity, resources (incl. infrastructure), tools, results, network
- Admin and financial templates





Proactive participation at EU events

 EU conferences, networking events, brokerage events (e.g. European Research & Innovation Days)

HII TRAININGS

- EU Info Days / Sessions
- NCP networks, events
- Follow the relevant social media accounts (especially Twitter)

Attend these events prepared: have an objective and description of your project ideas / partner proposition that you could *pitch* to others (e.g. PPT, profile/page, video, direct dialogue).



PROJECT COOPERATION

Socio-economic empowerment of the users of the sea

Interested in the HORIZON-CL6-2021-COMMUNITIES-01-04 call.

We could lead two Work Packages for a proposal focused on this call.

One WP focused on skills and training:

* Improved skills in ocean literacy education and awareness raising, social sciences, green skills and digital transformation to process and integrate large network input of gradually more 'Green and Blue Literate' citizens that are more engaged to take direct and sustainable action.

One WP focused on the dissemination and communication of the project:

* Developing the visual identity of the project, producing all dissemination materials (videos, infographics, visuals, story maps, printed items, etc), carrying out the communication of the project (publishing in different outlets, translating science knowledge into general public language, managing social media channels, presenting at conferences when needed, etc).

And we would be interested in collaborating in a WP focused on citizen science: * Curiosity-driven citizen science initiatives and outcomes connected to specific societal and blue bioeconomy-related socio-economic challenges on coastal climate adaptation and mitigation, coastal pollution, coastal biodiversity, circularity and sustainability or other aspects of coastal (eco)tourism and cultural events etc



- Check <u>CORDIS</u> for past and ongoing projects and their coordinators/partners
- Identify relevant reports, publications, policy papers and their authors/contributors -> Google: keywords + site:europa.eu
- Identify the relevant <u>European Partnerships</u>, <u>Missions</u>, <u>KICs</u>, other initiatives, etc. and their **members**
- Identify the relevant networks, umbrella organisations at European level → Google: keywords + Europe



Power of networks

- Umbrella/stakeholder organizations (e.g. <u>Eurocities</u>, <u>Greenovate!Europe</u>, <u>EARTO</u>, <u>EUA</u>, <u>LERU</u>, <u>EARMA</u>)






Final tips

Ready, set, Horizon Europe!

- Start early
- Double check the eligibility criteria
- Understand the co-creation, multi-actor collaboration, citizen engagement methodologies
- Expertise to consider at Consortium level:
 - Ethics
 - Data management
 - Intellectual Property Rights (IPR)
 - Socio-Economic Sciences and Humanities (SSH)
 - Responsible Research Innovation (RRI)
 - Open innovation
 - Gender aspects
- Highlight partners' operational capacity under Part B (sub-section 3.2)





Behind the scenes... Consortium building morals

- Be selective in accepting invitations: check the concept + partnership critically!
- 2. Consortium maintenance, not only consortium building
- 3. Conflict solving and mediation during proposal writing
- 4. Always have a plan B
- 5. Be patient: it takes time to build long-term networks!
